BACK PAIN: Sure steps to recovery

Sooner or later, an episode of lower back pain will knock 80% of us off our feet, according to Nicholas A. DiNubile, M.D., author of *Frame*-

Work: Your 7-Step Program for Healthy & Muscles, Bones and Joints.

WHEN BACK PAIN HITS. heed this

advice from DiNubile:

If you're experiencing pain for the first time, see a doctor to rule out a more serious (but less likely) cause such as a tumor, gallbladder problem or kidney stone, or an aneurysm.

■ If it's a minor repeat, try physical therapy, massage or acupuncture, or visit a chiropractor.

■ Once you "know" your back, follow this four-step routine: Spend one day off your feet, but avoid sitting; apply heat if you're achy or ice if you're injured; try mild stretching and movement; and take over-the-counter anti-inflammatory medicine if you're allowed.

COSMETIC SURGERY: Insist on a doctor with experience, focus

Cosmetic surgery's failure rate is underreported, says Robert Kotler, M.D., author of *The Essential Cosmetic Surgery Companion*. The Beverly Hills cosmetic surgeon with 30-plus years of experience urges you to call the office manager and ask if the doctor has:

- Board certification in dermatology, plastic surgery, ophthalmology, or head and neck surgery
- Had a cosmetic surgery fellowship
- Medical school teaching experience
- A 100% focus on cosmetic surgery
